Dr Rob Moodie is Professor of Global Health at the Nossal Institute for Global Health at the University of Melbourne. He was the CEO of VicHealth from 1998 to 2007.

He has also worked for Save the Children Fund, Medicins Sans Frontieres, the Aboriginal Health Service in Alice Springs, the Burnet Institute, the World Health Organization, and UNAIDS.

Rob chairs the Australian Government’s National Preventative Health Task Force, the Technical Panel to the Gates Foundation’s HIV prevention program in India, and the 2007 NRL Premiership winners Melbourne Storm.

He was Victorian Father of the Year in 2005. He is a regular contributor to radio and to the press, is co-editor of three books, including Hands-on Health Promotion, and has recently published Recipes for a Great Life with Gabriel Gate.
