ABOUT THIS WORKSHOP

TUHANZ – Applying the Treaty to our Practice

The workshop will focus on using the TUHANZ framework to assist health promoters to apply Treaty based thinking and planning to their health promotion practice.

The workshop is a practical, hands-on course, which explains how the articles of the Treaty can be applied to health promotion planning. Participants will be expected to determine and define Treaty based health promotion activities in line with their health promotion contracts and responsibilities.

By the end of this workshop, participants should have a clear understanding of Treaty articles and how they apply to health promotion, and a workable understanding of TUHANZ as a framework from which to plan Treaty based health promotion practice.

Participants are advised that the workshop will be reasonably demanding and fast paced so come prepared to work! Also, essential to the success and enjoyment of the day, a good sense of humour and an ability to share very good jokes that are appropriate *and* funny!

ABOUT THE TRAINER

The workshop tutor is **Adrian Te Patu**. For nearly three decades Adrian has worked in government departments, community organizations, for health providers, iwi or Maori tribal authorities, government reference groups and crown agencies. Various roles have included social worker, youth worker, counsellor, educator, lottery commission funder, health promoter and cultural advisor. Adrian is from Te Ati Haunui a Paparangi te iwi.
